2 CATHARINA (TRYNTJE/CATRINA HOPPE(N)(R) - Thanks to some wonderful research by Pamela J. Sears, in her article "Thomas Frederickszen and Maritje Adriaens: Origins of the Cadmus Family in Amsterdam Revealed," in the October 2006 issue of *The New York Genealogical and Biographical Record*, [vol. 137 pp. 179-187], we now know that Catharina's husband Frederick Thomase was baptized in Amsterdam on 1 Sep 1647 as Fredrick, son of Thomas Fredericksz and Marritte Arijjaens; wit. Hilletje Frerickts [Amsterdam Zuider Kerk, DTB 93:173]. Descendants of the Cadmus family should definitely check this article for more information on the European roots of the family.

115 MATTHEW (MATTHIAS/MATHEUS) HOPPE(R) - His widow married second Cornelius Voorhis, son of Stephen Janse (Voorhees). Cornelius' mother it would seem was Cathryna (Catrijntie) **Huyken** daughter of William Huyken and Annetje Andreias Willjard not Cathryna (Catrijntie) **Van Duyn**.

159 JACOMYNTJE (JEMIMA) HORN - *The Horne Family of Bloomingdale Road*, was written by P. F. (Field) Horne, not P. H. Horn. My apology to Mr. Horne.

200 ANDREW (ANDRIES) W. HOPPE(R) (p.68) In some editions the words under the picture of the house are partially covered, they should read, "age 91, applied for a pension on 1 Feb 1843 in Bergen Co. which was granted on 20 Apr 1848,"

308 - References - should be research of Heasley Rook not Rock, - sorry Heas.

310 ANNATJE HOPPER (page 101) - Should read "Research of Elmire L. Conklin of Warwick, NY, whose husb. Howard Conklin Jr. and son Nicolas L. Conklin are descendants." Sorry Elmire.

311 CORNELIUS HOPPER and his wife Hannah were bur. in the Chamberlain Cemetery, Belfast, Allegany Co., NY. From those gravestones, Cornelius died at the age of 58 years on 21 Feb 1814 (Bible has 22 Feb 1814) and Hannah d. 7 Apr 1839 (same as Bible) aged 78y and 6 mos.

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312 LAMBERT HOPPER - From his pension record, his second wife's name looked like **Lovica Moore**. Her tombstone in the Peru Village Cemetery reads: "Lovisa / Wife of / Lambert HOPPER / died Apr. 12, 1855 / AEd 86 Y'rs 9 Mo. / Dear Mother thou hast gone to the mansions of rest. / Where sickness and sorrow and death are no more. / Thou hast gone to enjoy thy God and the blest. / And I trust I shall meet thee on that happy shore." Buried next to her was "Rebecca / daughter of Rebecca / daughter of / John & Lovisa / MOORE / died March 10, / 1859 / AEd 50 Y'rs 10 M (NNY transcriptions). Since Rebecca Moore was 42 and living with Louisa Hopper in 1850, she was more than likely her daughter. Therefore Lovisa first husband was **John Moore**, and her maiden name is unknown.

336d EDWARD HOPPER - His second marriage to **Hannah Serrine**, widow of **Henry Entrott**, and sister of his first wife Abigail Serrine, was reported four months after Abigail's death. "Edward Hopper of Phillipstown married Miss Antrot (sic) of Putnam Valley (by Rev. D.D. Tompkins) in Feb 1841" [*Westchester Republican*, Peekskill, February 23, 1841]

469 MARIA HOPPER - Her birth date calculated from age at death on 7 Oct 1837 or 17 Oct 1837 would be 27 Jan 1780 or 6 February 1780. Her daughter Polly's birth date from age at death would be 28 Feb 1801, not 31 Mar 1802.

473 ABRAHAM HOPPER and his first wife Elizabeth are bur. Mt. Moriah Cem., Union Twp., Clermont Co., OH. in section 10. His second wife Sarah is bur. there in Section 8.

474 AARON (ARIE) HOPPER. An additional child has been found for Aaron Hopper and his wife Mary Sharp. From her burial record, in Spring Grove Cemetery, Cincinnati, OH. (Spring Grove #44954)

+954a Mary Ann - b. abt. 10 Nov 1810 (age/death) and d. 17 Aug 1887 Cincinnati, OH; m. William Wood, a white lead manufacture; both bur. Spring Grove.

481 ELIZABETH HOPPER, wife of **John B. Van Horn** - Passed down from the Van Horn-Tice family to descendant Joan Hagel, was information gathered by Abraham Terwilleger in 1907 on the Van Horn family. The dates are very specific and for the most part agree with baptismal and cemetery records. According to that information the following addition and corrections can be assumed. Elizabeth and John were married "28 Dec 1793."

Children of John B. **VAN HORN** and Elizabeth Hopper, (bap. at Paramus RDCh. except #981) [Additional information from Abraham Terwilleger is in *italics* - No changes to #1980, and 984]

981 Barent (Bernard) - b. 7 Sep 1797, no baptismal records can be found for him, he was mentioned in his gr.father Hopper's will da. 30 Mar 1820.

982 John Jr. - b. 25 Jul 1799 [likely 1798 as bap. 26 Aug 1798 at Par. RDCh. (no wit.)(p.72.)] and d. 24 Feb 1802. Not in gr.father Hopper's will .

983 Cornelius - b. 18 Aug, bap. 7 Sep 1800 at Par. RDCh. (no wit.)(p. 30); per Abraham Terwilleger he was b. 18 Aug 1800 and d. 2 May 1834, and m. *Phebe Le Ferge*. They were married 24 Nov 1821 at Madison Ave. Ref. Dutch Church in NY City. (IGI extract of church records wherein she was Phebe Lafurge) They lived in New York City and had 5 children. Terwilleger had spouses and children for each of their children.

492 ANNA (ANTJE) HOPPER - From the New Jersey Journal, Elizabethtown [NJ], Wednesday March 18, 1795: "States Bogert, Ramapough, gives notice that his wife Anne eloped from his bed and board without provocation and forewarns the public from harboring or trusting her on his account." Apparently his 20 year-old bride returned to his bed and board, for shortly before or after their daughter Anna was born, and they testified together as husband and wife in 1843 when her mother applied for a widow's pension.

516 MARGARET (PEGGY) HOPPER, wife of Abraham J. Van Horn (#980) son of John B. Van Horn and Elizabeth Hopper (#481). Passed down through the Van Horn-Tice family to descendant Joan Hagel, was information gathered by Margaret and Abraham's grandson Abraham Terwilleger in 1907 on the Van Horn family. The dates are very specific and for the most part agree with baptismal and cemetery records and may have come in part from a family Bibles. According to that information the following addition and corrections can be assumed.

Children of Abraham **VAN HORN** and Margaret (Peggy) Hopper [Additional information from Abraham Terwilleger in *italics* – No changes to #1042, #1045, #1047, #1048, #1049, and #1051]:

- 1043 Margaret - b. 20 May 1820; m. Abraham A. Banta (See Zabriskie #4699); [AT had *d. 6 May 1857; bur. Mahwah*; But from Ramapo RDCh. records of g.s. (p.86). " Abram Banta 1817-1894, and Margaret Van Horn, his wife (1820-1912)" (See Zabriskie #4699)
- 1044 Elizabeth - b. 4 Mar 1822; m. Lambert Romaine; *both bur. Pompton, NJ*; (See Zabriskie #4700)
- 1046 Garret "Hopper" - b. 29 Sep 1826; m. Mary Ellen Board (See Zabriskie #4702 and Clayton p. 335)
- 1050 Barney (Bernard) - b. 1835-36 (Bernard 14 in 1850/26 in 1860); m. *Harriet Board* not Ann ___?___ [The Ann listed after him in the 1860 census as wife, was actually the wife of his brother William who was listed before him.] See NY City, NY, NY 1870 Census: 5th election dist. p. 18, 712 Washington Ave.

546 RACHEL (RAGEL) HOPPER, One of the children of Rachel and her husband Paul Debow Sandford, has been identified as Alexander Sandford. Paul and his second wife Margaret Bush, had two children baptized at Pompton Reformed Church, Pompton Lakes, Passaic Co. NJ Alexander Sandford, b 16 Feb 1832, and Martin Van Buren Sandford, b 20 Oct 1835, no date of baptism given. From his birth date Alexander would have been Rachel's child as Rachel died 28 Aug 1832, not Margaret's.

568 HESSEL J. HOPPER - His wife's name was Ann Day or Dey (from marriage record). Her death date of 18 Oct 1844 age 71 has been confirmed by the posting of a picture of her gravestone to the web site "Find A Grave." She is buried as "Ann Dye widow of Hassell Hopper age 71" at Fairfield Reformed Churchyard, Fairfield, Essex Co., NJ.

600 RACHEL G. HOPPER - In some editions the words under the picture of the house are partially covered, they should read, " Twp. of Washington Co. of Brg., NJ da. 7 Jul 1853, pro. 4 Apr 1854"

712 JOHN HOPPER - Thanks to Jim Estes who found the article in *Genealogical and Family History of the Wyoming and Lackawanna Valleys Pennsylvania vol. II*, on Frank Hopper, son of John Dobb Hopper, and grandson of John Hopper. Though mug books are often unreliable, and this article was in error as it said John was

of German background and born in Pennsylvania, the dates in the article appear to have come from a reliable source, perhaps a Bible or other family record. From information in the article, compared with census and other sources, we have been able to identify seven additional children for John Hopper and now know the names of both of his wives.

His married first on 28 Mar 1803 "Elizabeth Mertz." She was born b.16 May 1780 and died in 1820. (W & L p. 424.) She was probably Elizabeth Martz as his daughter Catherine's middle name was Martz, and in 1800 there were seven families with the Martz surname living in Northumberland Co., PA and no Mertz family, and in 1810 there were twelve Martz families and only two Mertz families. From the census records of her children, who were living in 1880, Elizabeth was born in PA. Elizabeth would have died on or after 20 Nov 1820 when their youngest son John Dobbs was born and according to the biography, John married second on 23 Jan 1821 Mary Peet. (W & L p. 424.) Marrying so soon after his first wife died seems rather quick, on the other hand he had at least seven possibly nine children under 15, including a tiny infant, at the time. Mary Peet was born about 1789-1790 in PA.

719 MARY HOPPER - In 1820 Frederick Owens was in Wayne, Steuben Co., NY with 2 males under 10, 1 male 26-45, 2 females under 10, and 1 female 26-45 Mary. Neither Frederick nor Mary Owens was found in any other census records.

720 ANNA HOPPER and her husband **Elijah Reynolds** were buried in the Chamberlain Cemetery, Belfast, Allegany Co., NY. According to their tombstones, Anna died 15 Mar 1864 aged 71 years, and Elijah died 20 Jun 1862 aged 68 years. In the 1850 census of Belfast, Alleghany Co., it looked like Jane Reynolds age 81 was living with them, and it was assumed that she was likely Elijah's mother, however in 1860 Jane Reynolds was a 28 year old school teacher living with Elijah 65 and Anna 70, so it is more likely she was their daughter Jane 18 in the 1850 census. In 1860 Elijah was a constable with \$400 in real estate and no personal estate; he and Jane were born in NY and Anna was born in Pennsylvania.

721 ROCKWELL HOPPER - Rockwell Hopper and his wife and several of his children and their families are bur. in the Chamberlain Cemetery, Belfast, Allegany Co., NY. From the tombstone records, Rockwell died 20 May 1875 (Masonic emblem on stone) aged 83 y -20d and Elizabeth, wife of Rockwell d. 16 My 1865 aged 67y and 10m. 723 MARGARET (PEGGY) HOPPER, dau. of Cornelius Hopper and Hannah Rockwell was b. 11 Mar 1797;* and d. after 1 June 1860. The Bible record gave her birth date and only the surname of her husband. Thanks to the research of Kari Northup we now know that like her brother Ira and later her sister Tarry she and her husband migrated to Jefferson Co. WI, sometime after about 1840 when their son David was b. in NY. She m. **Nathaniel Sanford** sometime after 1819 when her father's estate was settle and she was single and before 1820-21 when dau. Melissa was born. From census records Nathaniel was b. abt. 1847-48 in NY and apparently died before 1 June 1860 when Margaret was the head of the household.

In 1850 living in Hebron, Jefferson Co., Wisconsin were Nathaniel Sanford, age 52, a farmer, Margaret, age 53, and and four children, and Ebenezer Hubbard 29, a farmer, all were b. in NY. By 1860 the entire family had moved to Kickapoo, Bad Ax Co. [later Vernon Co.], WI, where Margaret 62, occupation farming, (\$600 in real estate, \$200 personal) was the head of a household with son David 23, a farmer, and William Jag 34, a laborer. In the next house enumerated was her son Ephrem 30, a farmer, (\$800 in land and \$150 personal) and his wife Emelea and 3 children. Also in Kickapoo were son Ira a farmer (\$250 in real estate \$190 personal), and his wife Susan and 3 children living next to dau. Meliza (sic) Conant and her husband T. A. Conant, a farmer (\$200 in real estate \$175 personal) and their 3 children. Margaret could not be found in 1870.

732 SALLY HOPPER Bur. in In 1870 Sally Gregory 79 was enumerated in the house of Kelley (not Willy) Brine 38 a farmer (b. Ireland), Dinah Brine 38 and Sarah Bine 5. The record was in error as from her obituary his first name was O'Brien and their last name was Kelley. "Death has visited our community again, and taken from our midst Dinah Gregory, wife of O'Brien Kelley. She has been ailing for some time and died Friday evening. Her funeral took place Sunday from her late residence, at 2 o'clock P. M. She was a patient sufferer to the end. Age, 51 years. She leaves a husband and two children and a host of friends to mourn her loss.. ."Plattsburgh Sentinel July - Sept 1885 - Saranac — (Courtesy of Mary Slack Maynard). However from their gravestones in the Independence Cem, and the 1900 census he war Bernard Kelly. "Bernard, KELLY/ Died Mar. 22, 1904 ,AE 72 yrs" , "Diana.Wife of Bernard KELLY, Died Aug. 7, 1885, AE. 52 Yrs. 7 Mos. / Gone but not forgotten."

998 DANIEL DUBOIS(E) HOPPER – His first wife was Delina E. Woodrow, Laura A. ___?___ was his second wife. [Thanks to descendant Howard Hopper.]

1086 HESTER HOPPER - The Bible Record looked like she was married to Halsey Eakly or Eakely - from census records she was married to Jabez Eakley or Eakeley and can now have a + in front of her number.

1220c Margaret Hopper Very likely the dau. of Albert Hopper and Martha Harrison and the unidentified female b. 1800-1810) was the Margaret who m. ___?___ **Johnson**. Margaret Johnson was b abt. 1806-07 (age at death) and d. 4 Sep 1835 aged 28y. She was. reinterred on 30 Apr 1891 from Mount Pleasant Cemetery to #1220i William Hopper's plot in Spring Grove Cemetery, Cincinnati, OH (along with his parents Albert and Martha (Harrison) Hopper) and Amelia Morgan (see #1220h) believed to be their sister. She can now have a + in front of her name.

1220h Amelia Hopper was very likely the dau. of Albert Hopper and Martha Harrison and the unidentified female b. 1810-1820. Amelia who was b abt. 21 Mar 1818 (age at death) and m. **Nathaniel Morgan**. Amelia Morgan d. 5 Mar 1853 aged 35y-11m-12d. She was. reinterred on 30 Apr 1891 from Mount Pleasant Cemetery to #1220i William Hopper's plot in Spring Grove Cemetery, Cincinnati, OH (along with his parents Albert and Martha (Harrison) Hopper). and Margaret Johnson (see #1220c), believed to be their sister. She can now have a + in front of her name.

1472 JAMES HOPPER - from the funeral home records of several of their children his wife's maiden name has been learned - she was Mary Sayres.

Un-58 WILLIAM HOPPER - As posted in several paces on the internet. William Hopper was born in Rensselaer Co., NY on 31 Mar 1782 and died in Morrow Co., OH on 19 Mar 1868. [KC] Where those dates came from is unknown, but it is likely they came from a death certificate, tombstone or family Bible it seems that they did not know of a baptismal record in Rensselaer Co., for William Hooper son of **William Hooper** and **Eunice Leonard** who was b. 31 Mar 1782 in Rensselaer Co., NY, and bap. at the Schaghticoke, Reformd Dutch Church in Rensselaer Co., NY. The church records give the same birth date as in family record with no date of baptism, however his father's surname was given as **Hooper**. There was no William Hooper enumerated in New York in 1790. However, William Hopper was nearby in Argyle, Washington Co., New York, with 2 males over 16, 3 males under 16 and 4 females in the household. William and Eunice also had a son Isaac b. 5 Jan 1779 baptized at Schaghticoke.

William m. **Elizabeth Faulk** who was b. abt. 1791-98 in PA. [Rose Berg had b. 30 Dec 1790 in Northumberland Co., PA] In 1800 a William Hopper was in Augusta, Northumberland Co., PA age 16-25 with 1 female age 10-15. In 1810 William was also there aged 26-44 with 1 female under 10. In 1820 he was in Upper Mahoney also in Northumberland Co. age 26-45 with a female 26-45 and 1 male 0-10, and 1 male 10-16, and 2 females 0-10. In 1850 he was in Congress Twp., Morrow Co., OH, age 64 a farmer born in NY with no land

valuation, with him were Elizabeth 52, Lucy 22, Hetty 20, Elizabeth 18, and William 21 (all b. PA.) In the next house was their son Elias Hopper 23, his wife Mary and their dau. Martha E. 1. As all except William were born in PA they must have just recently moved to OH. In 1850 their son John Hopper was in Lincoln from the birthplace of his children he had been in OH at least 4 years. In 1860 William was 85 (a hotel keeper) and Elizabeth was 69 liv. with Lucy Ann 30 in Congress, William had \$1,500 in real estate and \$100 in personal account. According to an e-mail posted to the Morrow Co. Mailing list he was the proprietor of the Williamsport Hotel.
